

Are you a PhD student at the University of Leeds? Are you interested in gaining some tutoring experience? Do you have a strong knowledge of A level maths and great communication skills?

Learning Services provides academic skills support to undergraduates and taught postgraduates. Peer support has proved to be a powerful tool in our work, especially with new students. Our specialist Maths Support activities provide assistance to non-maths undergraduates but where their course has a significant maths element. You'll be working alongside the Skills@Library maths tutor to offer maths support to students at the university in our open maths drop-in sessions in Laidlaw Library

What does the role entail?

As a Maths Support Tutor, your main duties will include:

- Helping students, both one-to-one and in small groups, with the maths content of their degree programme;
- Listening to the students issues and deciding how best to help them;
- Explaining mathematical concepts to students;
- Helping students to understand their notes;
- Pointing students towards helpful resources, both online and in the library.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Maths Support Tutor you will have:

- An undergraduate degree in a maths-related subject;
- A good knowledge of school maths (including A level) and several degree-level topics;
- Excellent listening and communication skills;
- Excellent interpersonal and team working skills.



You may also have:

- Some experience teaching/tutoring in your department, or, if you are a first year PhD student, a view to undertaking such teaching in the future;
- Other maths tutoring experience.


