Are you an academic with the enthusiasm and ability to carry out cutting-edge teaching in Japanese Language? Are you passionate about delivering an exceptional student experience?

As a member of the Languages for All team, you will convene, teach and assess on our Japanese language modules possibly also contributing to the delivery and assessment of teaching of Japanese to students on our programmes leading to a language degree. You may also have the opportunity to contribute to the teaching of Japanese Language at degree level.

You will have experience teaching Japanese language at undergraduate level and have a qualification in teaching Japanese as a second language.

What does the role entail?

As a Lecturer (Teaching only) your main duties will include:

- Providing inspirational teaching and learning;
- Undertaking teaching on and assessment both of Japanese language modules delivered by Languages for All and as required at degree level;
- Preparing students for assessment tasks, by offering appropriate guidance; grading work once submitted and providing timely, constructive feedback in accordance with and with reference to published marking criteria;
- Facilitating the process of gaining feedback from students and evaluating module teaching in the light of experience, students' achievement and feedback;
- Administration associated with module delivery and maintaining accurate records including student attendance and assessment records;
- Attending and contributing to Languages for All team meetings and other activities at a level commensurate with the grade and fte.



- Planning your work and managing your time effectively, with due regard for deadlines.
- Setting priorities in your academic and professional activities, and work effectively without close supervision, assuming responsibility for your teaching and administration with awareness of deadlines and targets.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post. The precise nature and scope of the above duties will be agreed in consultation with the Director of Languages for All and Deputy Head of School.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Lecturer (Teaching only) in Japanese Language you will have:

- An first degree in Japanese or a related subject OR a Masters level qualification in teaching Japanese language
- Recent relevant experience of teaching Japanese as a foreign language
- Effective teaching skills and a range of delivery techniques and assessment methods for students who are undertaking university level study;
- Excellent time management and planning skills with a proven ability to manage competing demands effectively, responsibly and without close support;
- A high level of interpersonal and communication skills and a strong ability to communicate effectively in writing and verbally with students, academics and external audiences:
- Evidence of building strong working relationships within and, as appropriate, beyond your own discipline and the ability to contribute to successful projects and collaborations, working both individually and in a team;
- The ability to undertake administrative responsibilities associated with student education;

You may also have:



- A PhD or EdD;
- Experience of curriculum and assessment design;
- Experience of working in higher education.
