We are looking for somebody who is keen to learn the skills required to be a successful sports grounds person whilst gaining an academic qualification to support the hands on experience. You will also have the ability to work under clear instructions, with limited supervision which will allow you the opportunity to use your own initiative to diagnose problems.

What does the role entail?

As a Grounds and Gardens Apprentice, your main duties will include:

- Carrying out maintenance works and renovation tasks involved in the provision of grass playing surfaces.
- Grass cutting using push machines and ride on mowers, ensuring that sports pitches are maintained and problem areas are identified and treated;
- Carrying out maintenance of a range of synthetic surfaces;
- Gaining the knowledge to use and maintain all relevant tools, equipment and chemicals required in the role;
- Learning new techniques to support your academic studies;
- Working as part of a team of skilled professionals and make a positive contribution to the success of the team;
- Being fully aware of Health and Safety issues, taking reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of yourself and others;
- Attending college to complete your level 2 in Horticulture (Sports Turf), progressing to complete level 3 upon successful completion.

What will you bring to the role?

As an Apprentice you will have:

- GCSE grade C or above in Maths and English;
- Passed the relevant training body acceptance exam;
