Are you an enthusiastic teacher, committed to delivering a first class learning and teaching experience with a demonstrated ability to teach effectively at undergraduate and postgraduate level? Are you passionate about delivering an exceptional student experience in a research-intensive Russell Group University? Do you have expertise relating to Cognitive Neuroscience and the Neuropsychology of Language?

We are looking for highly motivated individuals to join an expanding team of dedicated student focussed Psychology lecturers. You will contribute to the School's research-led teaching and management of student education and will play an important role by contributing to the development of outstanding graduates and scholars.

This full-time three-year fixed-term position will include teaching responsibilities across the UG and taught PG programmes principally in the areas of Cognitive Neuroscience and Neuropsychology of Language, but with the expectation that you will be able to contribute to other teaching and student support activities elsewhere in these programmes.

What does the role entail?

As a Lecturer, at grade 8, your main duties will include:

- Undertaking innovative research-led teaching at different levels, including assessment and examinations and contributing towards the planning and development of module design, review and quality assurance mechanisms;
- Providing research supervision and helping to attract students to the University;
- Providing support and guidance to students, providing timely feedback, acting as a personal tutor, resolving issues and/or referring to specialist parties, where appropriate;
- Contributing effectively to the administrative processes and committee structures
 of the School/Faculty including taking on leadership roles and managing initiatives
 which facilitate School, Faculty or University performance or business;



- Contributing at an appropriate level to School and Faculty policy and practice in teaching;
- Pursuing, developing and take forward pedagogic developments, producing scholarly publications and disseminating findings across the University and externally;
- Involvement in the recruitment, management and development of staff and act as a mentor to more junior/less experienced colleagues
- Conducting individual or collaborative pedagogic projects to contribute to the strategic agenda and priorities of the School.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

You will report to Dr Peter Gardner, Head of School, via Dr Amanda Harrison, Director of Student Education.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Lecturer, at grade 8, you will have:

- A BSc (or equivalent) in Psychology;
- A PhD in a relevant psychological subject area;
- Evidence of the ability to contribute to Cognitive Neuroscience & Neuropsychology of Language teaching at both UG and PG level;
- Teaching experience equivalent to meeting the criteria of the Higher Education Academy, or a teaching qualification appropriate for higher education;
- An understanding of Leeds Student Education strategic plan;
- A proven record of teaching at undergraduate and/or postgraduate levels, with an enthusiastic approach to teaching and the ability to interact with students in ways that will enhance the student experience;
- Experience of proactively developing new teaching approaches and materials, assessment activities and contributing to curriculum development;
- Exceptional communication skills with the ability to collaborate with peers and inspire students;
- The ability to contribute to management and administrative processes and structures, including managing resources and/or staff.
