Are you an interpreting tutor with proven abilities to carry out professionoriented and cutting-edge teaching in Conference Interpreting and Business & Public Service Interpreting? Are you passionate about delivering quality teaching for the renowned MA programmes in Interpreting at Leeds?

You will carry out teaching on our MA in Conference Interpreting & Translation Studies and MA in Business and Public Services Interpreting & Translation Studies. You will manage, teach and assess a number of taught postgraduate modules. You will be expected to take administrative duties in the Centre for Translation Studies, such as admission interviews. You will also contribute to the School's activities, and the teaching of School-wide modules, as appropriate.

You will have extensive professional interpreting experience, as well as an MA degree or PGdip in Interpreting, with Merit or above. You will also have relevant teaching experience.

What does the role entail?

As a Teaching Fellow your main duties will include:

- Undertaking profession-oriented postgraduate teaching , including: interpreting modules in European languages (such as French, Spanish, or Italian, Portuguese, depending on your working language profile) and language-mixed modules in retour interpreting and interpreting skills as English-A trainer;
- Setting, marking, and assessing coursework and examinations;
- Convening interpreting modules, including timetabling, liaising with external tutors and coordinating interpreting assessments;
- Evaluating module teaching in the light of experience, students' achievement and feedback;
- Acting as a personal tutor for students, providing support and guidance;
- Administration associated with module delivery and maintaining accurate records including student attendance and assessment records;



- Playing an active role in recruitment exercises, including conducting admission interviews and forward-facing initiatives organised by the Centre for Translation Studies;
- Supporting and contributing to the learning and teaching activity of the School;
- Involvement in the administrative process and the committee structures of the School, Faculty and wider University.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post. The precise nature and scope of the above duties will be agreed in consultation with the Director of Translation Studies and the Deputy Head of School.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Teaching Fellow you will have:

- An MA degree or PGdip in Interpreting with Merit or above;
- Interpreting working languages in two or more of the following: French, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish;
- Extensive professional experience in Conference Interpreting;
- Experience in delivering profession-oriented and cutting-edge teaching of interpreting;
- Experience teaching on interpreting / retour interpreting as an English-A trainer;
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, including presentation skills and the ability to communicate effectively in English and your designated working languages;
- A proven ability to set priorities in your academic and professional activities, to work effectively without close supervision, and to assume responsibility for teaching and administration both individually and as member of a team.

You may also have:

- A relevant teaching qualification and a Higher Education Academy Fellowship;
- Previous experience in teaching all (or some of) the topics listed in the previous section;
- Experience in Business and Public Service Interpreting;
- A good working knowledge of the theory and practice of translation from your Interpreting working languages.
