Associate Professor in Project Management School of Civil Engineering

Are you an influential academic with the ability to carry out teaching and research in Project Management? Do you have an excellent research record, success obtaining funding and the vision and drive to tackle new challenges? Are you passionate about delivering an exceptional student experience in a research-intensive Russell Group University?

The <u>School of Civil Engineering</u> is the only School of Civil Engineering in the Russell Group to include a Project Management Group (PMG). The PMG is research and consultancy active and delivers two well established MSc degrees in Engineering Project Management and in International Construction Management and Engineering, attracting about 100 postgraduate students each year, reflecting the engineering and construction background of the School. The School aims to build on its existing strengths and expand the PMG in terms of educational portfolio, students and academics. At undergraduate level, degrees of MEng/BEng in Civil Engineering with Project Management are also supported by the PMG.

As Associate Professor in Project Management, you will be an outstanding individual, who will join us in leading our PMG for world leading research and education. You will have a PhD or other doctorate in civil engineering, project management or a relevant discipline and a related professional qualification or equivalent research or practical experience, and be able to demonstrate an internationally leading research profile in Engineering Project Management.

What does the role entail?

As an Associate Professor your main duties will include:

- Pursuing, leading and developing the strategic direction of research, innovation and impact at an appropriately benchmarked level, attracting research income and collaborating widely with leading industrial organisations on an individual and collaborative basis to underpin high quality research activity and programmes/projects;
- To conduct and lead research into Engineering Project Management issues at international level through externally funded research projects;
- Maintaining a high-quality record of regular and original research publications that are of national and international standing;



- Promoting the integration of your own research area with other research interests within and, as appropriate, outside the School, Faculty and University;
- Providing high quality postgraduate supervision and attracting research students to the University, and to supervise other students as appropriate;
- Undertaking research-led teaching at different levels on undergraduate and postgraduate taught courses, regularly collecting, and responding to, student feedback as well as being involved in the assessment of course work and examinations:
- Profess and promote the discipline of Project Management nationally and internationally, winning prestige for both the discipline and the University.
- Playing a significant role in the design, development, planning and review of modules and programmes (including distance learning) within Project Management;
- Contributing to the management and administrative processes and committee structures of the School, Faculty and University;
- Managing or leading major initiatives or areas of work (as either sustained or one-off projects) as well as taking on leadership roles which facilitate School, Faculty or University performance or business as required.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

What will you bring to the role?

- A PhD or other doctorate in civil engineering, project management or a relevant discipline, and a related professional qualification or equivalent research experience;
- Ability to demonstrate an internationally leading research profile or practice in Project Management;
- A proven track record of obtaining substantial competitive income for research in a broad range of multidisciplinary areas, with evidence of working collaboratively on cross-disciplinary projects both nationally and internationally;
- Show international links and evidence of effective engagement with national and international research agendas;
- Experience of proactively developing new teaching approaches and materials in the area of Project Management;



- A track record of research outputs in refereed publications of internationally excellent quality;
- Demonstrate the ability to work across subject areas, linking appropriately with other disciplines and research groups and operating effectively within different political environments;
- Experience of PhD supervision, acting as primary supervisor to successful doctoral graduates, if relevant;
- Demonstrate excellent organisational, team building and communication skills;
- A strong commitment to your own continuous personal development;
- Ability to contribute to management and administrative processes and structures, including managing resources and/or staff;
- A commitment to promoting and supporting diversity, equality and inclusion within the School.

You may also have:

- An ability to build partnerships with industrial, professional and public sector organisations on interdisciplinary collaboration, knowledge exchange and funding;
- Be able to demonstrate an internationally leading research profile or equivalent industrial experience;
- Experience of developing innovative approaches to teaching or assessment;
- Evidence of previous programme or academic leadership.
