Research Technician in Pig Science School of Biology

Are you looking for a career in pig science? Would you like to work in a team based at the farm facilities of one of the UK's leading research intensive Universities?

The Faculty of Biological Sciences requires a research technician, to work on their pig research projects, based at University of Leeds Farms. You will work as part of a research team and will be involved in pig husbandry, data collection and monitoring of research trials and administrative duties relevant to the post.

To apply for this role you be educated to GCSE level or have equivalent qualifications. You will also be experienced in the handling and husbandry of pigs or other large livestock. As well as having experience of working in a farm environment, with the aptitude to complete technically challenging tasks, with care and precision.

What does the role entail?

As the Research Technician your main duties will include:

- Performing accurate data recording on the farm, such as; feed and animal weights; temperatures; animal health monitoring; and other information as required; responding to any issues as and when they arise;
- Carrying out routine pig husbandry and care, including animal health monitoring, mucking/washing out, feeding and watering;

 General use and maintenance of technologically advanced automated feeding and weighing equipment;



- Lifting heavy objects such as sacks of feed, equipment and machinery;
- Assisting with Pig Unit administration through accurate and thorough data collection;
- Working in close association with other members of the Research and Production teams, ensuring that all work is completed efficiently and to the highest standards;
- Assisting academic staff, graduates and students in local procedures;
- Willingness to work outdoors in all weathers as and when required, including weekend and flexible working;
- Occasional use of farm and/or hire vehicles for university business.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Pig Research Technician you will have:

- 5 GCSE passes including Mathematics and English or equivalent qualifications;
- Experience in the handling and husbandry of pigs or other large livestock;
- Experience of working in a farm environment, with the aptitude to complete technically challenging tasks, with care and precision;
- The ability to perform physically demanding tasks, including lifting heavy objects such as feed, animals and machinery;
- Good organisational and time management skills, with the ability to meet deadlines;
- The ability to work effectively either as part of a team or lone working;
- The ability to work accurately with good attention to detail, and to resolve routine problems;
- Good IT skills, including MS Office software, with experience of record keeping;
- A valid driving license which enables you to drive vehicles owned or hired by the University of Leeds for farm business on UK roads.*

You may also have:

Ability to operate farm machinery;



- RSci (Registered Scientist) or RSci Tech (Registered Science Technician);
- Experience in animal research (this can include a period in Further or Higher Education);
- An A Level qualification or BTEC (or equivalent).

Notes:

You may not keep pigs or reside on premises where pigs are kept (other than University of Leeds Farms) whilst holding this post. You must refrain from consuming any pig-derived products on the University Farm site or bringing such products to the site.

*Current UoL insurance criteria require any driver to be over the age of 21 years and hold a full clean licence which enables them to drive the required vehicle on UK roads.
