The School of Design is seeking to appoint a Teaching Fellow in Fashion Cultural Studies who will contribute strongly in all aspects of teaching and provide academic leadership. The successful candidate will also demonstrate excellence in the planning and delivery of an innovative learning and teaching experience in the Fashion Cultural Studies discipline with particular emphasis in the Fashion in Context, Fashion Brand Analysis and Fashion Photography.

The School has established a broad portfolio of Design-focused programmes and the successful candidate will be expected to not only contribute to teaching but also shape the academic agenda and engagement with industry.

What does the role entail?

As a Teaching Fellow in Fashion Cultural Studies your main duties will include:

- Inspiring students through research-led teaching on undergraduate and postgraduate taught courses, taking a lead role in the development of modules and programmes and achieving high standards of student feedback;
- Promoting the discipline of Fashion Cultural Studies and internationally winning prestige for both the discipline and the University. Representing the University externally, developing and maintaining networks and promoting links with external organisations;
- Undertaking teaching and assessment including; setting, marking and assessing course work and examinations and provide appropriate feedback to students;



- Contributing to the design and supervision of postgraduate and undergraduate dissertations;
- Contributing to other postgraduate and undergraduate teaching activities (such as tutorials);
- Contributing to the review of modules, programmes and quality assurance mechanisms in the School of Design;
- Engaging in relevant impact and innovation activities;
- Participating and delivering major initiatives and/or multidisciplinary areas of work which improve the School, Faculty or University performance;
- The promotion of the values of collegiality within the academic community;
- Actively promoting and embedding University standards of employment practices across the School.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Teaching Fellow in Fashion Cultural Studies you will have:

- Masters degree in Fashion Cultural Studies or related area;

- Experience of teaching fashion related modules in higher education;
- Experience of proactively developing new and innovative teaching and assessment approaches and materials;
- A track record of effective team working and collaborative development;
- Excellent organisational and communication skills;
- Evidence of engagement with industry.
