Are you experienced in the provision, maintenance and calibration of a wide range of rock mechanics equipment used in a Rock engineering laboratory? Can you provide expert technical advice and training to staff and students on all aspects of geotechnical testing and sample preparation.

The School of Earth and Environment is looking for an experienced rock mechanics and engineering geology research and teaching technician to provide 4 months cover support to the School of Earth and Environment RMEGG laboratory facility.

What does the role entail?

As Research Technician, your main duties will include:

- Responsibility for the provision, maintenance and calibration of a wide range of rock mechanics equipment used in a Rock engineering laboratory;
- Provide expert technical advice and training to staff and students on aspects of geotechnical testing and sample preparation;
- Be responsible for demonstrating and supervising the use of a wide range of complex materials testing equipment including shear boxes, hydraulic and pneumatic test gear, permeametry equipment, electronic testing apparatus and other apparatus exclusive to rock mechanics engineering laboratories;
- Take responsibility for demonstrating correct use of coring and rock preparation equipment to a range of Staff and student users;
- Act as first point of contact for external contractors in the provision of calibration services and emergency equipment repairs. This includes pumps, pressure gauges, proving rings, pressure transducers load cells and LVDTs.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.



What will you bring to the role?

As a Research Technician you will have:

- High demonstrable skill levels in use and operation of rock mechanics equipment supported by a substantial theoretical knowledge and practical application skills;
- Proven experience in teaching and demonstrating Postgraduate level users in the operation and understanding of a wide range of geotechnical and rock mechanics equipment;
- Well-developed analytical skills;
- Good time management and planning skills, with the ability to respond flexibly to meet the needs of the cover role;
- A proven ability to work well both individually and in a team;
- The ability to work unsupervised and to use your own initiative.
