Are you an experienced digital media practitioner with a passion for teaching? Do you have technical skills in creative practice and digital media? Are you interested in developing your teaching skills in a world-leading media school?

The School of Media and Communication at the University of Leeds is a highly ranked department with a vibrant research culture and a commitment to excellence in teaching.

The School seeks to appoint a Teaching Fellow in Digital Media to join us from January 2020. This is an excellent opportunity for an ambitious digital media practitioner to apply their skills to teaching students at both undergraduate and taught postgraduate level. Students on the School's BA Digital Media and MA New Media undertake a challenging mix of theoretical study and practical learning, equipping them with the knowledge and skills required for a career in the digital media industries.

You will have extensive and up to date production experience in digital media, including animation and digital storytelling, and delivery through web, mobile and/or graphic platforms. Experience of virtual-, augmented- or mixed-reality and immersive technologies are essential. You will be a committed teacher and an outstanding communicator, able to contribute to undergraduate and taught postgraduate programmes. You will be interested in key debates about digital media and will develop teaching methods that encourage students to engage with the changing digital media environment.

What does the role entail?

As a Teaching Fellow in Digital Media your main duties will include:

- Teaching various aspects of digital media production at all levels of our taught programmes including assessment;
- Providing support and guidance to students, providing timely feedback, acting as a personal tutor, resolving issues and/or referring to specialist parties, where appropriate;



- Keeping abreast of developments in the field and undertaking activities necessary to maintain necessary skills;
- Developing and utilising innovative approaches to teaching and learning;
- Contributing effectively to the administrative processes relevant to your teaching;
- Attending staff meetings and preparing documentation as required.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Teaching Fellow in Media and Communication, you will have:

- A degree in media and communication or a related field;
- Up to date experience of digital media production including animation; experience of production in VR, AR, MR and immersive technologies;
- Demonstrable ability to teach digital media, demonstrating knowledge of pedagogic techniques and the ability to inspire students;
- The ability to assess student work, providing effective feedback to support student learning;
- Experience in providing pastoral or similar support to students;
- Understanding of issues raised by digital media social, political and ethical;
- Exceptional communication skills with the ability to collaborate with peers.
