Do you have experience of recruitment, placements or employability support? Do you have experience of managing a range of projects and initiatives?

Due to continued strategic investment in our <u>award winning</u> Employability Service, the <u>Faculty of Engineering</u> and <u>Faculty Mathematics and Physical Sciences</u> are looking to appoint a pro-active individual with high standards, drive and determination to deliver a range of high quality employability initiatives and activities across and within each Faculty.

You will deliver a series of engaging and innovative student employability activities to the student population across both faculties, whilst managing a range of new and existing employability enhancement projects.

## What does the role entail?

As an Employability and Placements Officer, your main duties will include:

- Designing and delivering a series of creative and engaging activities to prepare students for pursuing a range of work placement opportunities. This will include the delivery of lectures, workshops, individual appointments and mock interviews;
- Developing the existing core employability and placements lecture and workshop programme, ensuring the needs of individual Schools are balanced appropriately whilst undertaking regular reviews to ensure continuous improvement;
- Devising and implementing plans to increase student engagement with the activity you manage;
- Monitoring, evaluating and gathering feedback the effectiveness of the programmes you manage implementing changes as required; feeding back to relevant groups across the faculty;
- Pro-actively engaging with industrial contacts to generate opportunities for students, giving advice on appropriate selection methods, promoting opportunities and assisting with the selection process;



- Developing new, and maintaining existing and exclusive business links to expand the number and range of internship and placement opportunities available across both faculties:
- Working with colleagues across both faculties to develop common core business processes for specific areas;
- Leading on a range of new initiatives and projects which may include:
  - o Industrial placement year management
  - Overseas exchange opportunities
  - Scholarship opportunities
  - On campus summer internships
  - Other initiatives as they are established across the service.
- Developing a series of employability tutorials to strengthen the link between personal tutorials and student employability;
- Creating effective relationships with colleagues, including academics, supporting them to develop and deliver curricular and co-curricular opportunities by providing employability information, advice and guidance;
- Responding as a first line of support to placement problems, providing advice as within remit, and escalating serious and complex issues to the Employability Manager and/or designated Placement Tutor;
- Planning, co-ordinating and supporting delivery of events, including the STEM Careers Fair, that promote the interaction between employers, students and Faculty staff;
- Being involved in marketing and recruitment of prospective students presenting on Open Days and Applicant Days;
- Representing the Faculty of Engineering and Faculty of Mathematics and Physical Sciences at relevant University and external events and forums;
- Being a member of the Faculty's Employability Group, and relevant university employability forums.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.



# What will you bring to the role?

As an Employability and Placements Officer, you will have:

- Proven practical experience relevant to the role;
- Experience of supporting recruitment and selection processes or guiding associated practices;
- Experience of designing interactive and engaging presentations, workshops or lectures to a variety of audiences;
- Evidence of an ability to work independently, managing competing demands in order to meet tight deadlines whilst effectively delivering multiple complex projects;
- Experience of managing projects;
- The ability to build effective working relationships with a variety of colleagues and clients;
- An ability to work as a member of a team combined with the sense of responsibility needed to work unsupervised;
- The skills and ability to enthusiastically inspire, influence and coach others.
