Are you a PhD graduate, or close to completing your PhD, and looking for an opportunity to develop your experience in teaching within a Russell Group University?

We have a vacancy which would provide an ideal opportunity to build on your experience of laboratory demonstrating, assessment and/or project supervision, through contributing to teaching in the School Computing.

We currently have over 800 students from 45 countries studying with us and we also have around 45 academic staff engaged in teaching and research. We wish to recruit a Teaching Assistant to provide additional supervisory support for our undergraduate and postgraduate student projects, help deliver taught laboratory classes and support marking of student assessments.

Your role will involve supervising student projects and supporting academic staff through teaching in taught laboratories and contributing to marking of assessments. You will be making an important contribution to ensuring students receive an outstanding educational experience.

You will have technical experience in computer science, backed by a PhD qualification. In addition to demonstrating effective teaching skills, you will demonstrate excellent team working skills with an ability to work in a cross-cultural team, and also possess excellent communication skills.



What does the role entail?

As a Teaching Assistant, your main duties will include:

- Supervising and assessing individual and group-based student projects or dissertations, and contributing ideas and outline planning for student projects, providing feedback and guidance as required;
- Delivering teaching and assessment for practical classes (taught laboratory sessions) and tutorials/examples classes;
- Supporting academic staff with assessment of student work;
- Engaging in the administrative processes associated with student education as required;
- Working with our students as members of a learning community to provide world class education and an excellent student experience;
- Working closely with colleagues within the School and the University to ensure the effective delivery of student education;
- Integrating the University value of inclusiveness into all appropriate aspects
 of the job; respecting the dignity and diversity of all members of the University
 community and of visitors to the University.

These duties provide a framework for the role although they should not be regarded as an exhaustive list. Other duties consistent with the grade and title of the post may be required.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Teaching Assistant, you will have:

- A first degree (minimum 2:1) and a PhD (or be close to completion) in computer science or a closely related field;
- Relevant experience of laboratory demonstrating and/or supervising student projects within a higher education environment;
- An ability to contribute to teaching with an enthusiastic approach and the ability to interact with students in ways that will enhance the student experience;
- A high level of interpersonal and communication skills, including writing and presentation skills, and the ability to collaborate effectively with colleagues and students;



 Excellent time management and planning skills with a proven ability to manage competing demands effectively, responsibly and without close support.
