Would you like to have a key role in inspiring our students to develop to their full potential through provision of best educational experience and clinical teaching? Are you an enthusiastic clinician with an interest in dental education and the opportunity for an academic career?

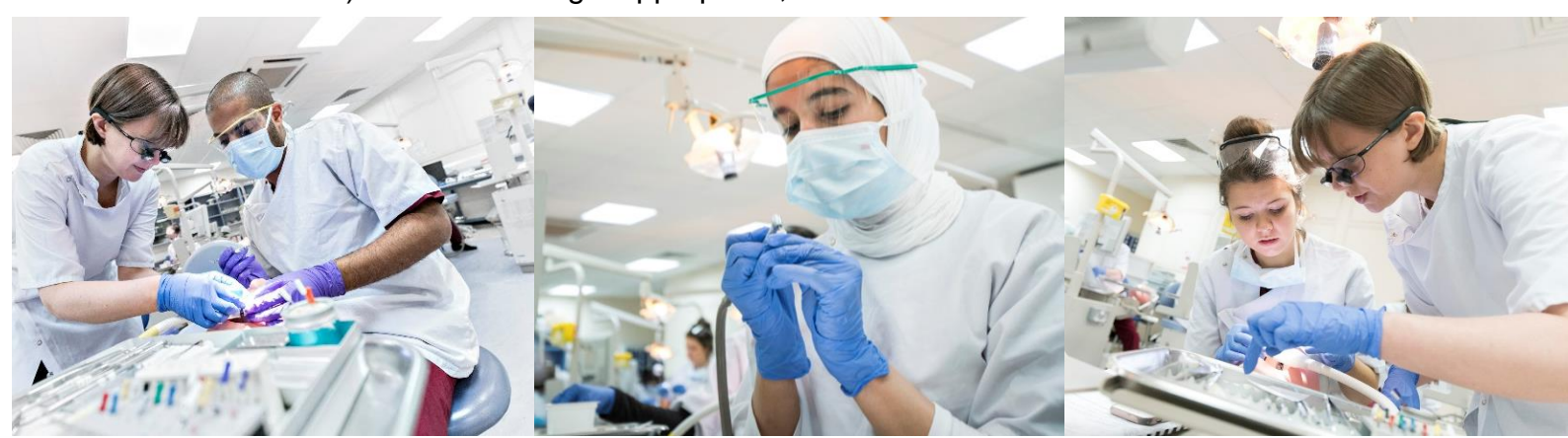
This is a unique opportunity for your development as a clinical teacher. With a dental qualification, full GDC registration and relevant foundation/general professional training or equivalent you must be capable of contributing across the broad range of restorative clinical disciplines within undergraduate dental education.

You will contribute to maintaining the high quality of clinical education of undergraduate students principally at the Dental Institute in Leeds, but also at one our Outreach centres if required. Responsibilities will include clinical supervision of students, and admin duties related to the provision of patient care and student education. This post will suit enthusiastic clinicians with an interest in dental education, who wish to explore the potential for an academic career in clinical dentistry.

What does the role entail?

As a Clinical Teaching Fellow in Restorative Dentistry your main duties will include:

- Contributing across the broad range of Restorative Dentistry clinical disciplines within undergraduate dental education and also being involved in the integrated dental teamwork teaching;
- Clinical Restorative Dentistry teaching within the clinical setting of the School of Dentistry/Leeds Dental Institute, pre-clinical (clinical skills) classrooms and the designated Outreach Centres (Beeston/Leeds, Bradford and Hull) in academic small groups;
- Effective supervision of students providing comprehensive dental care for adult patients in academic small groups, with direct intervention where required;
- Opportunities to develop your own subject and teaching material in accordance with curriculum and clinical requirements;
- Opportunities to assist with examinations, continuous assessments and assignments including question setting, standard setting, marking (written and oral) and moderating if appropriate;



- Assisting with co-ordination, further development and regular review of taught and shared modules as appropriate;
- Undertake relevant training and development to maintain up to date knowledge and own continuing personal and professional development.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

You will report to Head of Department and Division of Restorative Dentistry.

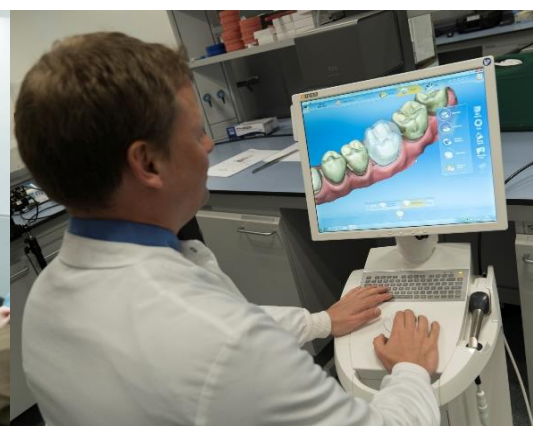
What will you bring to the role?

As a Clinical Teaching Fellow in Restorative Dentistry you will have:

- A dental qualification (BDS, BChD or equivalent) and full registration with the General Dental Council;
- Completed relevant foundation/general professional training or equivalent;
- Experience of working in General Dental Practice;
- Experience of providing training / demonstrating in a clinical or educational environment;
- Clinical experience, acumen and the ability to contribute to effective clinical and academic education in the disciplines of General Adult Dentistry in an educational setting;
- Ability to deal with basic General Dental Practitioner type issues, including simple exodontia while working in an Outreach setting;
- High levels of communication and presentation skills;
- Effective interpersonal and time management skills;
- Experience of enthusing and inspiring others and working successfully as a member of a team;
- Commitment to your own personal and professional development.

You may also have:

- Innovative ideas for dental education;
- Clinical experience, acumen and ability to contribute to effective clinical and academic education in the wider dental disciplines;
- Experience of software packages such as R4 and Software of Excellence;



- Possession of a formal teaching qualification or currently undertaking training in teaching.
