Are you an ambitious researcher looking for your next challenge? Do you have an established background in Ecological Economics? Do you want to further your career in one of the UK's leading research intensive universities?

The position is part of the Strategic Priorities Fund project "Living Well within Environmental Limits: From Pathways to Policy" led by Dr Dan O'Neill. This project will translate the findings of a recently completed two-year research project on national social and environmental performance within a "safe and just space" into a set of easily accessible tools and materials to facilitate knowledge exchange with policymakers. Given the tight timeline of this project, the applicant must have a proven track record in web-based data visualisation, and experience translating sustainability research results into policy-relevant materials.

What does the role entail?

As a Research Fellow, your main duties will include:

- Developing research objectives and proposals and contributing to setting the direction of the research project and team including preparing proposals for funding in collaboration with colleagues;
- Generating and pursuing independent and original research ideas in ecological economics;
- Developing an interactive website that will allow users to visualise and compare country performance over time, and explore scenarios for the future;
- Preparing a set of fact sheets to be shared with policymakers;
- Preparing papers for publication in leading international journals and disseminating research results through other recognised forms of output;
- Working both independently and also as part of a larger team of researchers, engaging in knowledge-transfer activities with policymakers.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.



What will you bring to the role?

As a Research Fellow you will have:

- A PhD or near completion i.e. the initial thesis needs to have been handed in at the point of application in ecological economics or a closely allied discipline;
- A strong background in quantitative data analysis, ideally with high proficiency in the "R" programming environment;
- Proven data visualisation skills for web-based applications;
- Knowledge of the "safe and just space framework" developed by Kate Raworth;
- Excellent writing skills, including general interest articles and policy briefs, and verbal communication skills including presentation skills;
- Good time management and planning skills, with the ability to meet tight deadlines, manage competing demands and work effectively under pressure without close support;
- A proven track record of peer-reviewed publications in high impact factor journals;
- A proven ability to work well both individually and in a team.

You may also have:

- Understanding of UK and European policy-making context, ideally with knowledge of Spanish and/or French;
- Experience of pursuing external funding to support research.
