Are you a health professional enthusiastic about education? Are you looking for an opportunity to develop your teaching skills in Higher Education? This is an exciting opportunity to be part of a dynamic and forward thinking team to enhance the health professions through innovative education. Do you have the skills to engage, enthuse and motivate students?

This is an ideal opportunity for an individual who is considering a career in health professions education. The post will allow you to contribute to our undergraduate programmes in Diagnostic Radiography and Healthcare Sciences (Audiology & Cardiac Physiology). Opportunities will be provided for you to access postgraduate training and development to enhance your career. You will be based within the Institute's Department of Specialist Science Education; a vibrant community of around 30 academic staff focussed on excellence in student education. The role will require you to develop and deliver occasional lectures and support team taught sessions across a variety of modules on our undergraduate programmes. This includes modules such as those introducing the role of the healthcare professional, preparation for practice, anatomy and physiology and others dependant on your interests and skills. You will also be involved in the design and marking of examinations and coursework. You will contribute to recruitment activities such as Open Days and outreach activities. You will have a relevant undergraduate degree and appropriate professional registration with an enthusiastic, creative approach to transferring knowledge and skills to students.

What does the role entail?

As a Teaching Assistant in the Health Professions your main duties will include:

- Developing and providing inspirational teaching and learning, which reflects professional standards and clinical good practice;
- Supporting and delivering modules, including lectures, tutorials and practical sessions at different levels on our undergraduate programmes in Diagnostic Radiography and Healthcare Sciences (Audiology & Cardiac Physiology);



- Contributing to the assessment of students' work, including marking exams and coursework;
- Utilising innovative approaches to learning and teaching with a strong emphasis on integrating theory and practice;
- Providing timely feedback to students on their studies;
- Providing advice to students on matters relating to academic expectations, their studies and progress;
- Contributing to the review and development of modules and programmes and to quality assurance mechanisms;
- Contributing to the recruitment and selection of students;
- Working closely with colleagues within the School and the University to ensure the effective delivery of student education;
- Maintaining a safe working environment, engaging actively in own continuous professional development, and undertaking administrative processes.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

You will report to Paul Baxter, Head of the Specialist Science Education Department, Leeds Institute of Cardiovascular & Metabolic Medicine (LICAMM).

What will you bring to the role?

As a Teaching Assistant in the Health Professions you will have:

- An undergraduate degree in a health profession discipline (including, but not restricted to, Audiology, Cardiac Physiology or Diagnostic Radiography);
- The ability to motivate and engender enthusiasm in students, with an enthusiastic, creative approach to transferring knowledge and skills;
- Excellent team-working and networking skills;
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, with a flexible, motivated and co-operative approach and good time management skills;
- Knowledge and experience of working as a health professional in a clinical setting;
- Excellent IT skills including use of MS office, virtual learning and scientific software;



- Current relevant professional registration (e.g. AHCS, HCPC, RCCP);
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a team;
- Evidence of commitment to own personal and professional development.

You may also have:

- Teaching experience in higher education;
- Experience of assessing students.
