Are you an early career researcher looking for a challenge? Do you have an interest in physical activity promotion in people living with and beyond cancer? Do you want to further your career in one of the UK's leading research intensive Universities?

Leeds Institute of Health Sciences are looking to recruit a full-time Research Assistant to work as part of a multi-disciplinary team on a study funded by Yorkshire Cancer Research. This study is a pilot randomised controlled trial of a digital physical activity intervention in people affected by breast, prostate or colorectal (bowel) cancers.

You will work closely with the local co-investigator and with London-based Principal Investigators. You will also contribute to the day-to-day running of the study, site setup and recruitment of participants, data collection, data processing, intervention delivery, conducting and analysing interviews, and supporting the writing-up of research for publication.

You will have a good first degree in a relevant discipline, Psychology or Health Sciences and previous research experience of Quantitative and Qualitative data collection and analysis.

What does the role entail?

As Research Assistant your main duties will include:

- Working as part of a larger research team (including others based in London and Sheffield) to contribute to overall study progress and day-to-day running of the study.
- Working with NHS research and clinical staff at recruiting hospital site in Doncaster (with potential for other hospital sites across South Yorkshire).
- Contributing to preparation of documentation necessary to obtain, maintain and update appropriate ethical approvals and research governance.
- Discussing details of the project with potential participants and recruiting/ consenting participants into the study.



- Communicating with study participants in person and via telephone, email and post (e.g. organising data collection at baseline and follow-up assessments, delivering intervention to participants in experimental arm of the study)
- Conducting qualitative telephone interviews with study participants. This will require the ability to work flexibly to suit participants.
- Maintaining regular communication with other members of the research team and collaboration with the study sites involved in the project
- Contributing to the wider Trial Management Group and support in the preparation of progress reports/other information for Trial Steering Committee meetings and Key Performance Indicator meetings with Yorkshire Cancer Research
- Analysing interview data and contributing to the writing-up of research for publication and public presentation in both academic and non-academic settings
- Following agreed trial standard operating procedures, and ethical and professional standards in research
- Providing additional research support for departmental activities as required
- Using initiative to manage and organise your own workload to ensure that project deadlines are met
- Being prepared to travel to London and hospital sites across Yorkshire on a regular basis as part of the role and to attend training events

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

You will report to Dr Rebecca Beeken.

What will you bring to the role?

As Research Assistant you will have:

- A good first degree (2:1 or above) in a relevant discipline, e.g. Psychology or Health Sciences
- MSc degree in a relevant discipline, e.g. Health Psychology, or equivalent experience
- Research experience of quantitative and qualitative data collection and analysis
- Familiarity with the process and requirements of conducting research in the NHS
- Knowledge of health psychology theory and concepts used in behavioural science



- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills, both written and verbal, and the ability to present to a wide range of audiences;
- A proven ability to manage time, prioritise workload and work to strict deadlines
- A proven ability to work independently and collaboratively within multidisciplinary teams
- Ability and willingness to travel regularly to hospital sites during periods of participant recruitment, which will require willingness to work flexibly
- Ability to travel to London and across Yorkshire for meetings
