Are you passionate about oral surgery? Are you keen to contribute to the training of the next generation of dentists? Do you have outstanding surgical skills and clinical knowledge and would you like to develop your career in oral surgery?

If the answer is yes to any of the above, join us and make our ambitious strategy a reality. We are seeking highly talented individuals to contribute to the department and so.

What does the role entail?

As a Clinical Teaching Fellow in Oral Surgery your main duties will include:

- Clinical supervision and teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate students in diagnosis and management of acute presentations, dentoalveolar infections, and post-extraction complications;
- Clinical supervision and teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate students in extraction of teeth under local anaesthetic;
- Clinical supervision and teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate students in surgical removal of retained roots, unerupted teeth and wisdom teeth under local anaesthetic;
- Communication with other dental and medical specialties, including general dental practitioners in order to deliver and plan effective and timely treatment for patients;
- Classroom and online teaching of the clinical and scientific basis of oral surgery;
- Contribution to assessments and examinations in oral surgery and related disciplines.

What will you bring to the role?

As Clinical Teaching Fellow in Oral Surgery you will have:

- BChD / BDS degree or equivalent;
- Full registration with the UK GDC;



- Significant post-qualification experience in dentistry, one or more of which will be in oral and maxillofacial surgery;
- Evidence of enthusiasm for oral surgery and teaching;
- Commitment to high quality clinical care, evidenced through completion of audit projects and/or quality improvement projects;
- An ability to respond to clinical challenges and work flexibly in order to optimise patient care and student education;
- Outstanding communication, presentation, and team working skills to operate effectively within the role;
- Evidence of a commitment to your own training and development.

- Membership/Fellowship of the Faculty of Dental Surgery or equivalent;
- A broad clinical experience in general dentistry;
- FHEA accreditation or a post-graduate qualification in education;
