Are you an academic with a background in water and sanitation governance? Are you an ambitious researcher looking for your next challenge? Do you want to further your career in one of the UK's leading research-intensive Universities?

You will work with Prof Anna Mdee to, develop and collaborate on a number of her research projects. You will have a relevant doctorate in international development or Social Sciences and you will deal independently with a wide range of people and support existing research as well as conducting new research. You will possess excellent analytical and writing skills and the ability to deal with a variety of tasks to set deadlines. The ability to work alone or as part of a team are essential, along with strong organisational skills.

The School of Politics and International Studies values an inclusive working and teaching environment and our aim is to develop a diverse staff and student community reflective of this. We select candidates on the basis of merit and ability and aspire to further diversify our School and Faculty community. We particularly welcome applications from candidates belonging to groups that have been underrepresented in the University including, but not limited to: Black, Asian and ethnically diverse people, people who identify as LGBTQ+, and disabled people.

What does the role entail?

As a Research Fellow your main duties will include:

- Working with and in support of Prof Anna Mdee on her research agenda, research projects and publications;
- Being an active researcher, conducting research, planning and undertaking fieldwork/conferences and analysing data;
- Preparing and collaborating on publications;
- Drafting project reports and preparing conference talks and project report contributions;



- Presenting research findings to academic and professional audiences and communicating complex data in accessible ways;
- Developing and supporting research applications and proposals for funding in the specified research area;
- Contributing to research planning and development within the School, where appropriate;
- Balancing the competing pressures of research demands and deadlines.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Research Fellow you will have:

- A completed PhD in International Development or Social Sciences;
- Experience of engaging with water and sanitation governance in your own research field:
- Experience of collecting, managing and analysing research data as relevant to your own field of research;
- Experience of writing up major research findings for dissemination and/or publication;
- A track record of high quality research in International Development or Social Sciences as related to water and sanitation:
- A track record of publications, with demonstrable potential for high quality academic publications;
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, including giving presentations and engaging effectively with a wide range of stakeholders;
- A willingness to pursue external funding to support water and sanitation governance research;
- Excellent planning, organisational and time management skills, with the ability to assess priorities and meet tight deadlines with minimal supervision;
- A high level of attention to detail and accuracy;
- A proven ability to work well both individually and in a team;
- Availability to travel to research sites and stay overnight away from home when required.



You may also have:

- Experience of communicating with academic networks;
- Experience of delivering research findings in different formats to diverse audiences;
- Experience in assisting in the preparation of major research grant applications.
