Are you able to design and deliver high quality teaching for undergraduate and postgraduate taught courses? Can you contribute to pedagogic developments relating to learning and teaching?

The Sustainability Research Institute (SRI) is an internationally leading centre of excellence of research and teaching in the environmental social sciences. The School of Earth and Environment has a highly successful suite of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes on sustainability and environmental management and policy. We are looking for an enthusiastic and self-motivated social scientist, with expertise in environmental policy and governance and in quantitative and/or qualitative research methods, to join our team to contribute to teaching and scholarship at the highest level. We are particularly interested in recruiting a colleague, who is comfortable facing a wide range of teaching styles (online, lectures, small group, 1-1 supervision) and broad sustainability related topic areas.

You will lead seminars, workshops and give lectures across the sustainability suite of Undergraduate and Master programmes. This will include taught modules, field courses, quantitative and qualitative skills teaching and supervising research projects. In addition to teaching experience, you should have interdisciplinary research and/or practice background in the broad area of sustainability. The post requires an ability to supervise a broad range of sustainability related PGT dissertations.

What does the role entail?

As a Teaching Fellow in Environmental Policy and Governance your main duties will include:

- Providing inspirational teaching and wider student education which reflects professional standards and industry good practice;
- Supporting and delivering seminars, workshops and lectures on environmental policy and governance, quantitative and/or qualitative research skills and broader sustainability related topics, as well as field work on undergraduate and/or postgraduate taught courses;
- Contributing to the review of modules, programmes and quality assurance;
- Assessing student work, including setting and marking exams and coursework;



- Designing and utilising innovative approaches to learning and teaching, including through digital media and blended learning;
- Contributing to the planning and development of modules and programmes within the subject area;
- Providing timely feedback to students, identifying the learning needs of students and defining appropriate learning objectives;
- Administering and documenting modules taught in collaboration with other academic and support staff as appropriate;
- Acting as personal tutor, providing pastoral care and supporting students to maximise the benefits of their time at Leeds:
- Designing and supervising undergraduate and taught postgraduate student research projects in the area of environmental policy and governance and on broader sustainability topics;
- Contributing to recruitment, widening participation and public engagement activities within the school;
- Investing in your own continuing professional development.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Teaching Fellow in Environmental Policy and Governance, you will have:

- A PhD in environmental policy and governance or a closely related topic;
- Experience from teaching in a University environment and an enthusiastic approach to teaching environmental policy and governance, other sustainability subjects and research methods, and the ability to interact with students in ways that enhances student experience;
- The ability to supervise undergraduate and postgraduate dissertations on topics related to sustainability and environmental policy;
- The ability to motivate and enthuse others, as evidenced for example by student feedback on previous teaching experience, with an enthusiastic, creative approach to transferring knowledge and skills to students;
- Experience of the delivery of teaching materials in a Higher Education setting, demonstrating effective teaching skills and a range of delivery techniques and assessment methods to teach effectively;



- An ability to use IT and digital technologies effectively and innovatively in the preparation and delivery of teaching material;
- Excellent team working and networking skills;
- Excellent communication skills and an ability to collaborate with peers and inspire your colleagues;
- An ability to contribute effectively to administrative activities;
- A strong commitment to your own continuous professional development.

You may also have:

- Experience of postgraduate student supervision;
- Experience in teaching quantitative research methods;
- Ability to contribute to management and administrative processes and structures, including managing resources and/or staff;
- A record of publishing peer reviewed journal articles, reports or other documents relevant to your field and employment background. This could include scholarly pedagogical outputs.
