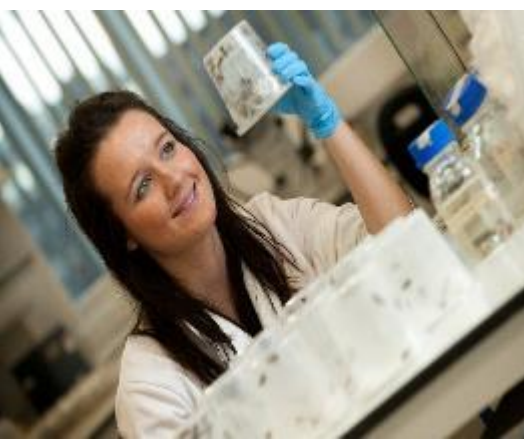
Research Technician - National Pig Centre Faculty of Biological Sciences

Are you looking for a career in animal science? Would you like to work in a team based at the National Pig Centre at one of the UK's leading research intensive Universities?

The Faculty of Biological Sciences requires a research technician to work on their pig research projects, based at the new state-of-the-art [National Pig Centre](#) at Spen Farm. The National Pig Centre is the UK's largest and most advanced facility for research into pig nutrition, behaviour, health & welfare and production systems. The National Pig Centre co-develops research programmes in collaboration with academic and industry partners to address current agricultural challenges. You will work as part of a research team and will be involved in pig husbandry, data collection and monitoring of indoor and outdoor research trials and administrative duties relevant to the post.

You should be educated to GCSE level, or equivalent, with a desire to work with animals and an interest in farming and the countryside. You should also have the ability to complete technically challenging tasks, with care and precision.

The University of Leeds and the Faculty of Biological Sciences are committed to providing equal opportunities for all and offer a range of family friendly policies. What does the role entail?

As a Research Technician your main duties will include:

- Performing accurate data collection on the farm, such as: feed and animal weights; temperatures; animal health monitoring and other information as required; responding to any issues as and when they arise;
- The day-to-day care of indoor and outdoor trial pigs as and when required;
- Carrying out routine pig husbandry and care, including animal health monitoring, mucking/washing out, feeding and watering;
- General use and maintenance of feeding and weighing equipment;
- Lifting heavy objects such as sacks of feed, animals and equipment;
- Reporting any requirement for repairs and maintenance of the ancillary equipment and machinery to the Pig Unit Manager;
- Working collaboratively with other members of the Research and Production teams, ensuring that all work is completed efficiently and to the highest standards;
- Assisting academic staff, graduates and students in local procedures;
- Willingness to work outdoors in all weathers as and when required, including weekend and flexible working*;
- Occasional use of farm and/or hire vehicles for university business.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

What will you bring to the role?

As a Research Technician you will have:

- 5 GCSE passes including Mathematics and English or equivalent qualifications;
- The ability to complete technically challenging tasks with care and precision;
- The ability to perform physically demanding tasks, including lifting heavy objects such as feed, animals and machinery;
- Good organisational and time management skills, with the ability to meet deadlines;



- The ability to work effectively either as part of a team or lone working;
- Good IT skills, including MS Office software, with experience of record keeping;
- A valid driving license which enables you to drive vehicles owned or hired by the University of Leeds for farm business on UK roads.**

You may also have:

- Experience or interest in working with animals or in a farm environment;
- Ability to operate farm machinery;
- Experience with Microsoft Access;
- RSci (Registered Scientist) or RSci Tech (Registered Science Technician);
- Experience in animal research (this can include a period in Further or Higher Education).

Notes:

You may not keep pigs or reside on premises where pigs are kept (other than University of Leeds Farms) whilst holding this post. You must refrain from consuming any pig-derived products on the University Farm site or bringing such products to the site.

**Please note this post will require some weekend work.*

***Current University of Leeds insurance criteria require any driver to be over the age of 21 years and hold a full clean licence which enables them to drive the required vehicle on UK roads.*
