Overview of the Role

Are you an ambitious scientist inspired to work in a multi-disciplinary team to develop solutions to a major environmental problem? Do you have a PhD in environmental science and a commitment to solutions-focused work?

This exciting position will explore the relationships between Indonesian land use change, regional climate and tropical peatland fire. You will be part of a large multi-disciplinary team working for the KaLi Project (https://kali-project.com/), a collaboration between Indonesian and UK universities. The KaLi Project aims to explore drivers and impacts of Indonesian fires and to identify routes to build resilience through sustainable development. You will work with other team members to analyse how different interventions can reduce peatland fire. This work will be a timely contribution to the fire governance and research community, allowing them to better understand the current state of knowledge and future needs for improving our understanding of the impacts of tropical fires.

Main duties and responsibilities

- Exploring interactions between tropical peatland fire, regional climate, land use change and human wellbeing;
- Working with members of a multi-disciplinary team to help develop solutions;
- Presenting in-person and virtually to a range of stakeholders and partners;
- Maintaining your own continuing professional development.
- Using your initiative to identify new areas for research, develop new research objectives and methods, and extend the research as dictated by initial results;

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

This role will be directly guided by Professor Dominick Spracklen, but will also benefit from wide ranging interactions will the KaLi project team.



Qualifications and skills

Essential:

- A PhD or near completion (i.e. the initial thesis needs to have been handed in at the point of application) in a relevant discipline;
- A strong background in research on tropical land use change, tropical fire and human wellbeing;
- A demonstrated commitment to interdisciplinary and solutions-focused work;
- Demonstrated commitment to communicating research through peer reviewed publications;
- The ability to work on own initiative to organise, prioritise and plan work independently and effectively to meet tight deadlines.

Desirable:

Knowledge of Indonesia and Bahasa Indonesian.
