Apprentice Laboratory Teaching Technician, Faculty of Engineering and Physical Sciences.

Do you have an aptitude for science and in particular working in a laboratory environment? Do you want to begin your career as a teaching technician in one of the top Universities in the country?

We are looking for an apprentice, eager to start their career as a Laboratory Teaching Technician. As an apprentice you will provide support to the School of Chemical and Process Engineering and you will support the suite of materials analysis labs in the Faculty of Engineering Physical Sciences apprenticeship scheme.

As part of our apprenticeship technical training scheme, you will be placed on an appropriate Education Technician apprenticeship course at level 3, offered by <u>CSR</u> <u>Scientific Training Group</u>, this will be online training. You will be mentored by one of our senior technicians in our laboratories, where you will be given specific training in this area. On completion of your training, you will have an ideal skill set to go on to a successful career as a teaching technician, having learnt several disciplines associated with working in a lab environment.

What does the role entail?

As an Apprentice Laboratory Teaching Technician, your main duties will include:

- Providing teaching support in the undergraduate laboratory practical classes;
- Taking personal responsibility for the preparation of materials, specimens and reagents;
- Being responsible for routine calibration and maintenance of equipment;
- Maintaining records of consumable levels and equipment, and purchase requisition stock to maintain an acceptable level;
- Being responsible for the safe disposal of hazardous waste within specified guidelines;
- Portable Appliance Testing of equipment and keeping appropriate records;
- Taking part in regular team meetings with technicians;
- Working in accordance with health and safety procedures, hazard, risk, COSHH assessments and local policies and procedures;
- Undertaking manual handling of laboratory equipment and movement of gas cylinders, using correct manual handling processes;



• Engaging fully with the relevant training courses for the apprenticeship and actively engaging in learning during the course of your day-to-day role.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

What will you bring to the role?

As an Apprentice Laboratory Teaching Technician, you will have:

- A minimum of Grade 4, (A*-C) at GCSE or equivalent in a science subject (gained by the time of taking up the role);
- Proven numeracy skills, for example as evidenced by a minimum of Grade 4 (A*-C) at GCSE or equivalent in Maths (gained by the time of taking up the role);
- Proven written and oral communication skills, for example as evidenced by a minimum of Grade 4 (A*-C) at GCSE or equivalent in English (gained by the time of taking up the role);
- Evidence of an aptitude for laboratory work, with an interest in science subjects and a willingness to learn new skills in this area;
- Good interpersonal and verbal and written communication skills;
- Developed organisational skills with the ability to complete tasks within set timeframes;
- The ability to work proactively and independently, and also as part of a wider support team;
- Excellent IT skills (particularly Microsoft packages);
- The ability to perform manual handling duties, for example as required to move laboratory equipment.
