We are looking to recruit an enthusiastic and motivated academic with expertise in French and Francophone Studies and with proven abilities to deliver high quality teaching.

The School of Languages, Cultures and Societies at the University of Leeds is seeking to appoint a full-time Lecturer in French and Francophone Studies. The post is fixed-term for 12 months, with a start date of 9 September 2024. It is on a Teaching & Scholarship contract with a 20% workload allowance for research. The Lecturer will teach, supervise and examine in French and English at undergraduate level, and teach, supervise and examine in English at postgraduate level. They will be joining a French section with 11 full-time and 6 part-time members of staff teaching a degree programme that ranges widely across French and Francophone studies.

Do you meet the essential requirements for the post?

- First degree in French and completed PhD in French Studies.
- Ability to teach the second-year modules Aspects of French History 1789-1914 and Politics and Society in France since 1945.
- Command of the French language equivalent to C2 on the CEFR.
- Ability to teach the French language in English and French at undergraduate level.
- Ability to contribute to other French modules at all Levels, especially French Cinema.
- Strong research profile, in line with career stage, within the field of post-1789 French and/or Francophone history, politics or society.



- Contribute to the School's MA in Film Studies.
- Contribute to Open Days and other recruitment activities for French and the wider School.
- Academic Personal Tutoring.

What else will you bring to the role?

As a Lecturer in French and Francophone Studies, you will demonstrate the following:

- An enthusiastic and innovative approach to delivering inspirational teaching in French and Francophone Studies and the ability to interact with students in ways that will enhance the student experience;
- Ability to prepare students for assessment tasks, by offering appropriate guidance; grading work once submitted and providing timely, constructive feedback in accordance with and with reference to published marking criteria;
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, including presentation skills;
- A proven ability to set priorities in your academic and professional activities, to work effectively without close supervision, and to assume responsibility for teaching and administration, while also managing and developing online environments;
- Ability to collaborate with colleagues in the delivery of language and culture teaching;
- Contributing effectively to the administrative processes of the School as appropriate;
