Research Fellow in The Global Health History (Soviet focused) School of History

Are you an ambitious researcher looking for your next challenge? Do you have an established background in either Global Health History or History of the Soviet Union? Do you want to further your career in one of the UK's leading research intensive Universities?

The School of History invites applications for two full-time postdoctoral research fellows, to contribute to the Wellcome Trust funded project 'The Soviet Union, the WHO and Global Health, 1957-91'. Successful candidates will join a four-year research project (starting October 2025) investigating the role of the Soviet Union in global health between 1957 and 1991. Each appointee will conduct historical research on Soviet involvement in global efforts – both through the World Health Organisation and bilateral ties – to tackle one of the following diseases: malaria, polio and HIV/AIDS. Each appointee will also take responsibility for one broad theme of research on Soviet involvement in global health. These include: vaccines and vaccination, health education and propaganda, and medical surveillance and resourcing. Duties will also include writing for publication, presenting research findings to a variety of audiences, and liaising with key project partners.

Candidates should have an academic background either in the history of the Soviet Union or in health history. Training in Russian language will be available for project members.

Main duties and responsibilities

As a Research Fellow your main duties will include:

 Designing, planning and conducting a programme of investigation, in consultation with Dr Robert Hornsby;



- Making a significant contribution to the dissemination of research results, such as by publication in leading peer-reviewed journals, and by presentation at national and international meetings;
- Working independently and as part of a larger team of researchers, both internally and externally, to develop new research links and collaborations and engage in knowledge transfer activities where appropriate;
- Evaluating methods and techniques used and results obtained by other researchers and relating such evaluations to your own research;
- To contribute to, and to encourage, a safe working environment.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

Qualifications and skills

Essential

- A PhD (or close to completion) in Global Health History or Soviet History or a closely allied discipline;
- Experience in working with a variety of historical source materials and research methods relating to either global health or the Soviet Union;
- A developing track record of high quality research outputs;
- Excellent communication skills, both written and verbal, and the ability to communicate your research to a wide variety of audiences
- A proven ability to work well both independently, specifically to design, execute and write up research and as part of a wider team;
- A strong commitment to your own continuous professional development and to fostering positive research culture

Desirable

- Experience of working with historical source materials relating to malaria, polio or HIV/AIDS;
- Experience of working with Russian language source material;
- Experience in conducting oral history interviews;
- Experience of conducting research within established ethical guidelines;
