Overview of the Role

The School of Education, University of Leeds, seeks to recruit a Research Assistant for an evaluation project funded by the Education Endowment Foundation. Please contact Professor Louise Tracey on <u>l.c.tracey@leeds.ac.uk</u> for more information about the evaluation project.

The successful candidate will be working within a small team in the School of Education. The role involves trial co-ordination to collect teacher and pupil data from schools as well as conducting school visits to interview teachers and conduct pupil focus groups. The projects are currently in set up stage and the Research Assistant is required to oversee the day-to-day management of the evaluation from set up through to publication of the final report. Whilst there may be some opportunities to work across the two trials each Research Assistant will lead on one evaluation.

The appointment is available on a fixed term basis from June 2025-November 2026, 100% FTE

Main duties and responsibilities

- To conduct the day-to-day management of the efficacy trial. Duties to include: development and management of data bases; development of research tools, qualitative and quantitative analysis and interpretation of research data; and writing up of research results.
- To contribute to the preparation of research proposals and applications to external bodies
- To undertake appropriate organisational and administrative activities connected to the research project, including organising data collection, liaising with the delivery teams, communicating with participating schools, field work in schools.
- To develop and initiate collaborative working internally and externally, duties to include: the building of internal contacts and participation in internal networks; collaboration with colleagues on joint projects as required; participation in and identification of external networks in order to share information and identify potential opportunities for collaboration and possible sources of funding; attendance at and contribution to relevant meetings.



• To provide guidance to other staff and students, as required, as well as coordinating the work of a small team of data collectors.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

Qualifications and skills

- PhD in Education or Psychology (or equivalent area)
- Knowledge in an education-related field to engage in high quality research
- Knowledge of a range of research techniques and methodologies and skilled in qualitative and quantitative analysis
- An understanding of working within data protection and ethical guidelines
- Ability to plan, priorities and organise own work and the work of others

Desirable

- Knowledge of Randomised Controlled Trial methodologies
- Ability to write up research work for publication in high profile journals and engage in public dissemination
- Knowledge of Research Governance
