## **Overview of the Role**

Do you have a strong and growing research record and a commitment to securing research funding? Are you passionate about delivering world-leading research and an exceptional student experience through outstanding teaching and support?

We are looking for someone with vision and research capability to join our TESOL team and work flexibly in language education within the School of Education. We are one of the UK's leading schools of education. Our TESOL team has an established international reputation with a research centre in language education. Colleagues in the School undertake research focusing on improving children's life chances through education; inclusion and youth; health education; and curriculum, policy and practice in national and international contexts.

As Lecturer in TESOL, you will carry out research and teaching primarily in language education. You will teach on the MA TESOL and TESOL Studies. There is also an opportunity to contribute to our MA Education and other programmes depending on your research and teaching expertise.

## Main duties and responsibilities

### Research

- conducting research, innovation and impact activities, including regular publication of high-quality research of international standing.
- leading and collaborating on grant applications to attract research income as an individual and where appropriate within a team, to underpin high quality research activity at national and international levels.
- promoting integration of your research area with other research interests within and, as appropriate, outside the School and Faculty.



- supervising doctoral students and attracting research postgraduates to the School.
- demonstrating a high level of knowledge of research methods relevant to language education and other relevant aspects of education.

### Teaching

- undertaking teaching and associated activities, as appropriate, in accordance with University and School workload agreements.
- leading design, development and planning of modules and programmes in TESOL and language education.
- demonstrating a high level of subject knowledge relevant to Masters level TESOL and language education;
- collaborating with colleagues within the School/Faculty to ensure that our TESOL programmes and research maintain their quality and are sector leading.
- supervising Masters and undergraduate dissertations.
- contributing to the development of innovative approaches to learning and teaching.
- applying current educational technological advances to learning and teaching.
- providing positive, engaging and constructive support and guidance to students as a personal tutor, supervisor and academic tutor, resolving issues as necessary and/or referring to specialist parties, where appropriate.

### Citizenship

- demonstrating a high level of interpersonal and communication skills in interactions in academic and non-academic settings.
- possessing an ability to work effectively, responsibly and independently, and to work under pressure, with sound organisational skills, including managing time effectively and prioritising tasks appropriately.
- managing or leading on tasks (as either sustained or one-off projects) that facilitate School, Faculty or University performance or business.
- being involved in the recruitment, management and development of staff and acting as a mentor/probationary adviser as required.
- contributing constructively and positively to administrative processes and committee structures of the School, Faculty or University.



- exhibiting and working positively in line with the University's values of collaboration, compassion, inclusivity and integrity.
- participating in personal professional development opportunities as appropriate.
- maintaining a safe work environment, including ensuring compliance with legislation and the undertaking of risk assessments.

### **Qualifications and skills**

#### Essential

As a Lecturer in TESOL you will have:

- a doctorate degree in language education, English applied linguistics, or relevant closely allied discipline.
- experience of teaching English language education as a subject at universitylevel.
- evidence of excellent subject knowledge in TESOL, language education and related areas sufficient to ensure delivery of high-quality teaching at master's level.
- a clear research agenda in TESOL/language education that complements and/or adds to the research strengths and priorities of the team and School.
- demonstrable experience of contributing to external research funding applications and the development and management of research projects.
- a track record of generating internationally excellent research outputs, including as sole or main author.
- experience of providing high quality, effective and appropriate support and guidance to students.
- experience of effectively delivering university-level teaching, including developing and preparing teaching materials, and development and management of novel modules and/or programmes.
- evidence of an understanding of current research issues in TESOL and language education and integrating these into teaching.
- a demonstrated ability to carry out successful doctorate supervision.
- experience of supervising undergraduate and postgraduate dissertations.



- evidence of identifying and using appropriate teaching techniques and methodologies, the application of educational technology;
- a high level of interpersonal and communication skills in interactions in academic and non-academic settings.
- a capacity to enthuse others, work successfully as a member of a team, work collaboratively and participate fully and/or lead on projects and initiatives.

#### Desirable

- experience of programme leadership and partnership coordination.
- fellowship or senior fellowship of the Higher Education Academy, or another university level teaching qualification.
- relevant work experience outside higher education.
- experience of inter- or transdisciplinary work in language education, drawn from within or outside of higher education.
- experience of working in an international setting relevant to the position.
- experience of reviewing or editing research or professional journals.
- membership of professional or research organisations.
