We collaborate with many partners on solution-focussed research and we teach a range of undergraduate and masters programmes that aim to equip our students to be part of progress towards sustainability.

This post will lead our postgraduate teaching on environmental planning and regulation, and contribute to the MSc Sustainability & Consultancy programme as well as supporting undergraduate teaching including our 'Year in Industry' programme.

We are keen to offer our existing industry partners more in terms of small research projects and knowledge exchange and this post provides a focus for developing that programme of work. We would always like to extend our network of business and industry partners, building on our fantastic alumni connections, and this post will contribute to improving our approach and further nurturing this network.

# Main duties and responsibilities

- Undertaking research-led teaching [specifically in sustainability or environmental planning and regulation] at different levels, including assessment and examinations and contributing towards module design, review and quality assurance mechanisms;
- Supporting learning applied in workplaces through, for example, supervision of industry-based projects or industrial placement visits;
- Being actively involved in research, innovation and impact at a national and international level, as well as contributing to local School/Faculty activity;



- Building research connections and managing relationships with businesses, regulators and public organisations;
- Maintaining a record of high-quality publications of national and international standing;
- Attracting research funding individually and collaboratively to underpin high quality research activity and research programmes/projects;
- Promoting the integration of your own research area with other research interests within and, as appropriate, outside the School and Faculty;
- Providing research supervision and helping to attract students to the University;
- Providing support, guidance and timely feedback to students, acting as a personal tutor, resolving issues and/or referring to specialist parties, where appropriate;
- Contributing effectively to the administrative processes and committee structures of the School/Faculty including taking on leadership roles and managing initiatives which facilitate School, Faculty or University performance or business.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

# **Qualifications and skills**

#### Essential

- A PhD in sustainability or environment in a policy, planning or business context, with an applied focus to consultancy, infrastructure or manufacturing represented in the UK economy;
- A track record of research outputs in the area of applied sustainability practice in non-academic organisations, in refereed publications of internationally excellent quality;
- A successful record of obtaining external research funding with the potential for obtaining further funding in the future;
- An ability to contribute to and develop interdisciplinary collaborative research projects in a broad range of areas;
- A proven record of teaching in a University environment, with an enthusiastic approach to teaching environmental planning and regulation and the ability to interact with students in ways that will enhance the student experience;



- Experience of proactively developing new teaching approaches and materials in the area of applied sustainability, particularly in environmental planning and regulation;
- A high level of interpersonal and communication skills, and a strong ability to communicate effectively in writing and verbally with students, academic and external audiences;
- An ability to contribute to management and administrative processes and structures, including managing resources and/or staff.

#### Desirable

- Membership of the Institute of Environmental Management & Assessment or similar professional body;
- Experience of supporting learning applied in workplaces e.g. through industrial placements or visits;
- Experience of providing postgraduate student supervision;
- Experience of contributing to academic leadership.
