Project: iDem, Inclusive Democratic Spaces for Deliberation and Participation

iDEM aims at addressing the barriers in deliberative and participatory democratic practices by using natural language processing methods as enablers in addressing political inequality for deliberation and participation in democratic spaces. In collaboration with other EU partners, we will develop techniques to detect difficult words and constructions in the texts of the target domain and for the target audiences by means of fine-tuning large language models. The research objective for this task is aimed at addressing the following problems: (i) the need to transfer prediction models across different user groups and domains, often with small amounts of training data; (ii) the need to deal with multiple languages; and (iii) the need to combine heterogeneous levels of annotation on the levels of words, passages, sentences or texts, often with noise and inconsistent annotations. We will also focus on experimenting with explainable AI, so that the classifiers can provide explanations to ensure that the right choices are made for the right reasons.

Main duties and responsibilities

As a Research Assistant, your main duties will include:

- Contributing to the 'iDem, Inclusive Democratic Spaces for Deliberation and Participation' project, as directed by Professor Serge Sharoff;
- Being an active researcher, conducting research and analysing data;
- Planning and managing your own research activity in collaboration with the Principal Investigator throughout the remaining project duration, and engaging in impact and knowledge exchange activities as appropriate;
- Preparing and collaborating on publications;
- Communicating research results through publications, conference presentations or other recognised forms of output as required;
- Balancing the competing pressures of research demands and deadlines.

These duties provide a framework for the role and should not be regarded as a definitive list. Other reasonable duties may be required consistent with the grade of the post.

Qualifications and skills

Essential:

- A Masters in computational linguistics (or near to completion meaning the initial version of the thesis has been submitted) or another discipline relevant to the project;
- Advanced quantitative analysis skills and a desire to learn more;

- Demonstrated experience of conducting quantitative data science research;
- Proven ability to write to the standard required for research reports and international publications;
- Excellent organisational and project management skills, with the ability to meet tight deadlines and work effectively under pressure;
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills including presentation skills and the ability to communicate effectively with a wide range of stakeholders;
- A proven ability to work well both individually and in a team, with an open mind-set.

Desirable:

- Experience in fine-tuning large language models
- Experience in text simplification or in developing chatbots
- Experience in Bayesian techniques for uncertainty quantification
