We are seeking a highly motivated Research Fellow to support the completion of the CholOut-EWS project. This post will synthesise project findings, finalise the end-of-project report, and lead a publication focused on data governance within early warning systems.

Main duties and responsibilities

- Designing, planning, and conducting analytical and qualitative synthesis work
- Leading drafting of the final project report and a peer-reviewed publication
- Liaising with international partners and coordinating cross-country inputs
- Supporting communication with the funding organisation
- Disseminating research through publication and presentations
- Working collaboratively across UK and Bangladesh teams
- Evaluating project methods and results for synthesis work
- Contributing to a safe, inclusive working environment
