Job Description for Lecturer- Teaching and Scholarship Grade 7

Main duties and responsibilities for Grade 7

Teaching

- To undertake research-led teaching¹ in core theoretical and applied areas of midwifery on undergraduate and postgraduate programmes where appropriate
- To provide appropriate and timely feedback on student learning on assigned modules
- To contribute to the setting and assessment of coursework and examinations
- To contribute to the review of modules, programmes and quality assurance mechanisms
- To utilise innovative approaches to learning and teaching
- To contribute to the planning and development and delivery of modules within the relevant subject area
- To provide support and guidance to students, resolving issues and/or referring to specialist parties, where appropriate
- To be involved in the supervision of students undertaking research projects as appropriate
- To undertake teaching in the School as determined by the workload model and requirements of the school
- Contribute to the quality assurance mechanisms of student learning as appropriate

Scholarship

- To be actively involved in pedagogic developments relating to student education, practice, knowledge transfer and knowledge generation
- To develop and maintain scholarly pedagogic publications, disseminating findings across the University and externally
- To take part in knowledge transfer activities, where appropriate and feasible

Administration

- To provide an effective contribution to the management and administrative processes and committee structures of the School and Faculty.
- To lead initiatives (sustained or one-off) as requested and as appropriate that support School programmes, priorities and performance

General

- To carry out the duties of the post in accordance with the University values and standards, and in line

- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Experience of teaching students and / or professional groups (formal or informal teaching) in (insert professional area)
- Evidence of a developing scholarship portfolio relevant to the School (for example through presentation of papers, contribution to grant applications, sourcing funding streams, supporting research network activities)
- Experience of supporting students in practice
- A willingness and ability to deliver innovative, effective and inspiring teaching
- The ability to motivate and engender enthusiasm in others, as evidenced for example in student feedback obtained from teaching
- Knowledge and awareness of the potential of current educational technological advances in learning and teaching and of innovative approaches to teaching
- Can demonstrate a clear understanding of teaching agenda at local, regional or national level.

Job Description for Lecturer- Teaching and Scholarship Grade 8

You will draw on academic experience to underpin and carry out scholarship, teaching, leadership and management in the field of midwifery within the School and Faculty. You will make significant contributions to the School and more widely by delivering innovation in student education, leading developments in related scholarship. PhD student supervision is expected and contribution to the School's research agenda. Administration and staff supervision duties will be expected for Grade 8 staff.

Main duties and responsibilities for Grade 8:

General:

- To undertake research-led teaching2 at different levels on undergraduate and/or postgraduate taught courses, regularly collecting, and responding to, student feedback
- To contribute at an appropriate level to School and Faculty policy and practice in teaching
- To have a significant involvement in the design, development and planning of modules and programmes within the subject area as required
- To have a significant involvement in the review of modules and programmes and in quality assurance and enhancement as required
- To develop innovative approaches to learning and teaching as appropriate
- To provide timely feedback and assessment of coursework and examinations
- To provide support and guidance to students, resolving issues and/or referring to specialist parties, where appropriate
- To act as a personal tutor, including pastoral care and supporting students in maximising the benefit of their time at Leeds
- To be involved in the supervision of students undertaking research projects as appropriate
